

Toddlers Without Tears



Description

This universally-available parenting program aims to help prevent externalising behaviour problems such as oppositional defiance, hyperactivity and aggression in the preschool child. The program has been designed to be suitable for all families in a community setting. Many of the major public health problems facing society today (crime, mental health problems, drug abuse, family breakdown) have been shown to have their antecedents in early behaviour problems.

The group parenting program was designed by paediatricians, psychologists and maternal and child health nurses. The program was piloted for suitability, relevance, and feasibility. Now, we are conducting a randomised trial in six Melbourne local government areas, to measure effectiveness in preventing preschool externalising problems.
