Featured podcast: *The Life Scientific* on how to change behaviour

We all know how to be more healthy. And yet we are also remarkably good at NOT doing what we know is good for us. We keep meaning to get fit, but the sofa seems so much more appealing than a run. We know we shouldn't have another slice of cake, but we do.

Behavioural psychologist, Professor Dame Theresa Marteau wants to understand why, despite the best of intentions, so many of us fail to adopt healthier lifestyles. She talks to Jim Al-Khalili about her life and work and why, after studying the evidence she changed her mind about how to change our behaviour.

Back in the 90s, it seemed reasonable to assume that telling people they were at high risk of dying would jolt them into eating more healthily and taking more exercise. Now we know better. Thanks in large part to research pioneered by Theresa, we have a much more sophisticated understanding of what drives our behaviour. It turns out that small

Library Update

Sharing Ovid searches just got easier

You can now link directly to your search history so your colleague can rerun the search with just one click

1. Select *Copy Search History Link* below your search history to copy the link to the clipboard.
2. Send the link to the recipient.
When the recipient clicks on the link or copies and pastes it into a browser, the search history will load. **The recipient must have access to the database the search was created in to rerun the search.**

If the recipient is outside the RCH network, they'll require an [OpenAthens login](#) for this to work.

Instead of seeing the search immediately they'll see an Ovid login prompt:

1. Select *OpenAthens*
2. Search for *royal children's hospital*
3. Log in to OpenAthens when prompted

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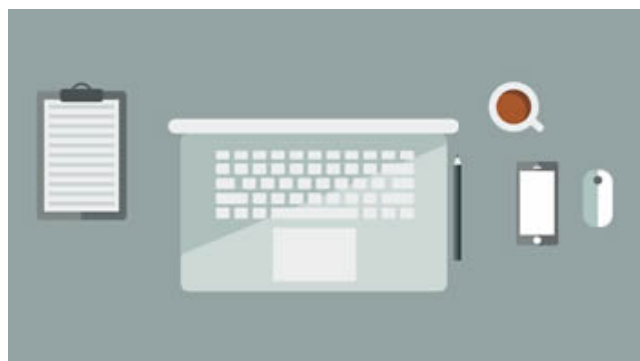

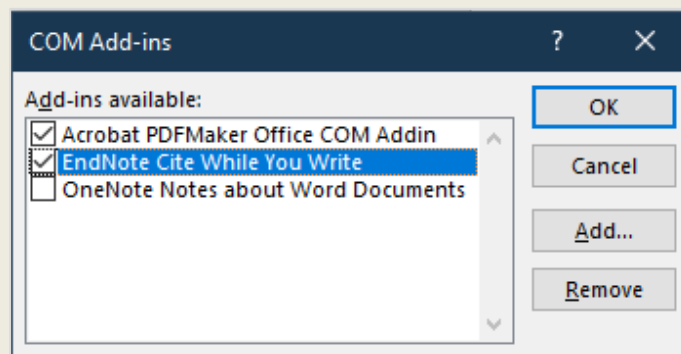
EndNote Tip: the EndNote toolbar in Word disappears after Office 365 upgrade

If you've recently been upgraded to Office 365 you might find that, upon opening Word, the EndNote toolbar has vanished. Here's how to get it back:

1. In Word, go to *File/Options/Add-ins*
2. In the *Manage* field make sure *COM Add-ins* is selected, and click *Go*
3. Check the box *EndNote Cite While You Write*, then *OK*

If that doesn't solve the problem, or if *EndNote Cite While You Write* is not listed there, you may need to try some more advanced solutions.

Try this [EndNote support article](#). If you're doing this on an RCH computer, some solutions require admin rights, so you'll need to contact IT to apply the fix.

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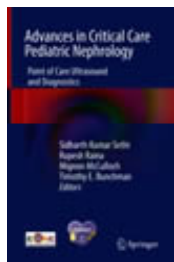

The book covers advances in critical care pediatric nephrology, including care of sick children with acute kidney injury. It contains detailed guidance on point of care ultrasound in children with acute kidney injury and use of biomarkers in critically sick children.

This is an annual theme-based book with the current theme of 'point of care ultrasound in critical care pediatric nephrology and newer diagnostics in acute kidney injury'.

This is the first book of the set of books to be published annually with a different theme related to critical care pediatric nephrology each year with the collaboration of the Pediatric Continuous Renal Replacement Therapy (PCRRT) Foundation and International Collaboration of Nephrologists & Intensivists for Critical Care in Children (ICONIC).

This annual updates book contains 20 chapters, written and edited by leading experts in pediatric intensive care, pediatric nephrology and nephrologists specializing in point of care ultrasound from across the globe.

It includes top studies in the last few years in critical care pediatric nephrology on point of care ultrasound and diagnostics. Chapters cover scientifically updated information by international experts on each topic. It offers assistance to pediatricians, pediatric nephrologists, pediatric intensivists and residents.
