#### **Ovid Medline global reload for 2024**

Medline via Ovid will be updated with the 2024 edition of MeSH (Medical Subject Headings) on 5<sup>th</sup> March, 2024.

#### Implications for Ovid Medline saved searches

- **Check your personal saved searches** on Ovid Medline and apply changes for the 2024 MeSH. Add new terms and replace changed/deleted terms with the more up-to-date terminology.
- Check the Scope Note for each MeSH term carefully for the definition, year of entry and previous indexing terms.

#### Implications for searches in PubMed and The Cochrane Library

Changes to MeSH will also impact saved searches in PubMed and The Cochrane Library, since they both use the MeSH thesaurus. Search lines containing thesaurus terms in PubMed and The Cochrane Library must be checked and updated with the current version of MeSH.



### LibKey Nomad browser extension now installed in Edge

LibKey Nomad provides one-click access to Librarysubscribed fulltext articles on many journal platforms.

This browser extension is now installed in all Edge browsers across RCH. **Here's how to activate it**:

1. In Edge, select *Extensions* from the toolbar then LibKey Nomad



2. Use the *Select Organization* drop-down menu to search and select *Royal Children's Hospital* 



When you search Google, Google Scholar, or PubMed (and many other platforms) you'll see notifications where fulltext may be available. If you're working off site use your <u>OpenAthens</u> login to get access.

# EndNote Tip: create a new reference for online resources

Enter online resources such as reports or webpages manually into your EndNote library:

- 1. Go to References/New Reference
- 2. Change the default *Reference Type* from *Journal Article* to *Web Page*

Fields that must be populated will vary depending on your chosen output style; some may be required fields. The example pictured here is for a Clinical Practice Guideline.

### **BMJ Best Practice – latest updates**

BMJ Best Practice brings a step-by-step approach to decision support. It is structured around the patient consultation, covering diagnosis, prognosis, treatment, and prevention.

### **Changes to Document Delivery charges**

From Monday, 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2024, new charges will be implemented for our <u>Document Delivery</u> service.

There is a **small increase for Non-urgent requests, and a new Express service added**. Turn-around times are for Monday to Friday only.

Non-urgent: \$11.00 per item, typically received within 1 – 4 days .


**Urgent**: \$30.00 per item, typically received within 48 hours.

**Express**: \$45 per item, typically received same day if requested before 1pm.

If an Urgent or Express order cannot be fulfilled by an Australian supplier the Library reserves the right to use commercial suppliers to obtain the item from overseas. In this event we cannot guarantee delivery within the stated turn-around time but a \$30 charge will still apply to cover costs.



### **Health and Science News**



- Vaccination, testing, clean air: COVID hasn't gone away – here's where Australia needs to do better: The virus continues to infect millions of people globally and the WHO recognises COVID as an ongoing pandemic. [The Conversation]
- Here's why infants are strangely resistant to COVID: The team found stark differences between children and adults in both adaptive and innate immune responses. [Scientific American]
- New evidence suggests long COVID could be a brain injury: Treating long-COVID brain fog like a brain injury can help patients get back to some semblance of normalcy, researchers said. [Medscape]
- Examining the medical mystery of a child hepatitis outbreak: An analysis of a sudden global outbreak of hepatitis in children that occurred in 2022 finds although the primary suspect is highly likely to be an infection by multiple viruses, many questions still puzzle researchers. [Scimex]
