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

## Systematic review automation tools review

Systematic reviews can be tedious and time-consuming. Automation tools can assist in speeding up the process, as shown by <u>Clark et al (2020)</u> who completed a full systematic review in just two weeks.

#### Library performance, 2023

We perform many tasks in our role as the link between information and its application in patient care, education and research

Where possible we measure these tasks to ensure our time and money is spent in the right areas. Here's how the numbers stack up for just some of our activities in 2023:

- Responded to 2,667 enquiries
  - ... which were received in person, as well as by email, phone or web-based form.
- Loaned out 452 items from our collection ... which is an 8% increase on 2022.
- Supplied 467 articles to other libraries ... which is about the same as the previous year.
- Provided 409 articles or book chapters to campus staff
  - ... a 52% increase on 2022. Of these, 74% were delivered on the same day, and 16% were delivered within 24 hours.
- Clocked up 89,388 database searches ... a 9% increase on the previous year.
- Conducted 619 one-on-one literature searches
  - ... which is a 20% increase on 2022, and more than two per day.
- **Taught 185 in group Training sessions**

... which is a little down on 2022 due to much smaller numbers in the MDRP/STEP groups.



- Welcomed 34,013 visits to the Library
  - ... a 55% increase on 2022, with staff and students seeking our expertise face to face, accessing print collections, and using Library facilities such as computers and workspace.
- Managed online journal and book collections ... where we saw a whopping 77% increase in ebook access reaching 35,372 chapter downloads. There was a small increase of 8% in online journal access which reached 302,817 full text article downloads.
- Managed 1,714 OpenAthens accounts ... which were logged into 30,316 times to access the Library's online resources from outside the RCH network.

#### New MIMS site: eMIMS elite



#### Search Tip: Quickly switch to another database

#### In Ovid databases

When you have searched in an Ovid database such as Medline or Embase, use the Change link to select a different Ovid database and start another search.

Select *Continue* to start a new search in the selected database.



#### In Ebsco databases

When you have completed your search in Medline, for example, use the Choose Databases link to select a different database, such as CINAHL.

Be sure to deselect Medline first, then choose OK.

From malaria, to smallpox, to polio – here's how we know life in ancient Egypt was ravaged by disease: Fear of disease was so pervasive it influenced social and religious

- → Many Al tools lack adequate safeguards to prevent mass health disinformation: The public health implications are profound when considering that more than 70 per cent of people use the internet as their first source for health information. [Scimex]
- ⇒ The COMBAT-AMR Assessment Framework:
  a blueprint to addressing AMR: The Assessment
  Framework includes five assessment tools that can
  be used individually or collectively to align with
  national AMR action plans. [Doherty Institute]
- ⇒ RACGP settles exam suit out of court: The college hasn't released the amount that it settled for. [Medical Republic]
- → Australia's chief scientist takes on the journal publishers gatekeeping knowledge: Opponents say the model is fundamentally flawed because it enshrines a national debt to wealthy international publishers. [The Guardian]
- ➡ Whistleblower's decades long fight to save patients from dangerous research: A research fellow at Toronto's Hospital for Sick Children began her fight for patient safety nearly 30 years ago. [BM]]
- ➡ How to avoid being duped by predatory journals: Understanding the hallmarks of predatory publishers and knowing the risks of submitting to them is the best way to avoid being misled. [BMI]
- Up to one in seven submissions to hundreds of Wiley journals flagged by new paper mill tool: More than 270 of its titles rejected anywhere from 600 to 1,000 papers per month before peer review. [Retraction Watch]
- Western Australia is planning free RSV immunisations for babies as cases rise will other states follow suit?: "It is the number one cause of hospitalisation in children under five, and a quarter of these children are in intensive care". [ABC]
- ➤ NHS services in England are told to stop routine prescribing of puberty blockers: Drugs will be approved only for people taking part in clinical research trials. [BM]]

- ➡ Blood analysis predicts sepsis and organ failure in children: Patterns of gene expression predict whether the child would develop organ failure within the next 24 hours. [Scimex]
- Building a heart atlas: researchers map organ in stunning detail: Cutting edge imaging techniques reveal how cells organise as the heart develops. [Nature]

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

Cystic fibrosis has seen dramatic advances in treatment since the last edition, including targeted cystic fibrosis transmembrane conductance regulator (*CFTR*) protein modulators for most *CFTR* gene abnormalities. This new fifth edition is an update and expansion of the rapid clinical and scientific advances

in improving prognosis, and the impact of COVID-19, all of which has transformed conventional models of care. This text was edited by Sarath Ranganathan and chapters by John Massie, Susan Sawyer, Shivanthan Shanthikumar and Peter Simm.




